**Confirm Your Identity Using the 'UK Immigration ID Check' App** 

Download and install the 'UK Immigration ID Check' app on your smartphone.

Complete the identity verification process as guided by the app.


Failing to meet attendance expectations can lead to serious consequences, including termination of your studies and visa cancellation.

We monitor attendance through electronic systems and tutor registers, as maintaining satisfactory attendance is a visa condition. Regular attendance is vital not only for vour academic success but also for visa compliance and future applications. In cases of illness or emergencies, you must inform the college at ugicattendance@ greenwich.ac.uk and may need to submit an absence request form with supporting evidence from your registered GP. ### **Personal Tutor**

Each student will be appointed a personal tutor and will be expected to attend a two-hour personal tutorial session each week. Personal tutorial sessions cover issues such as culture shock and home-sickness, time management, dealing with stress, preparing for exams and assessments. The sessions consist of group activities and discussions and some one-on-one discussions with the tutor. Students are encouraged to discuss issues with their personal tutor at any time.
